
In order to audition, you will need to use Sign Up Genius to reserve your spot. This will limit the number of people in the theatre at one time.

Dressed as a health care clown, Nancy uses humor therapy to uplift children and elders in need. Nancy began her healthcare clown career with the Big Apple Circus Clown Care Unit in 2004 as Dr. Gracie at Boston Children's Hospital. She was a founding member of the Hasbro Children's Hospital Clown Care Team in Providence, Rhode Island in 2005 and worked for Healthy Humor, Inc. at LaRabida Children's Hospital in Chicago. Nancy has appeared on stage with local production

companies as well as on film. She has performed in Hyderabad and Visakhapatnam, India, among other cities and orphanages for Tsunami Relief efforts. In addition to her clowning, Nancy speaks Portuguese, is an accomplished costumer, musician, magician, face painting artist and a licensed certified occupational therapy assistant. Nancy is also the West/Central Michigan Community Relations Coordinator for Operation Christmas Child, a Samaritan's Purse Project, and volunteers at her local church youth group, Life Stream Church of Allendale. You can even find Nancy working with the nonprofit arts company, Vaudeville Chicago, bringing fun and joy to their local children and seniors. Nancy is currently working on writing her first children's picture book and she is a novice milliner.
