The Mouse That Roared tells the story of the fictional European Duchey of Grand Fenwick. Finding itself on the wrong end of a trade dispute with the United States, and noting America's generosity in rebuilding the countries it had fought in World



War II, Grand Fenwick's rulers hit upon the idea of declaring war on the U.S., losing, and then reaping a Marshall Plan -style handout. The plan, proposed by Grand Fenwick's Advisor, is approved by

the Duchess, who dispatches an invasion force under the command of Grand Fenwick's hapless Chief Forest Ranger. Due to a series of happenstances and misunderstandings, however, Grand Fenwick's plan goes terribly wrong...

This rare comedy uses the magic of the theatre to enjoy the delight of the "impossible."

Sylvia


Auditions are Nov 11 & 12. Shows Jan 30-Feb 1, Feb 7-9; Feb 13-15

Greg's career as a financial trader is winding down, while Kate's career, as a public-school English teacher, is beginning to offer her more opportunities. Greg brings home a dog he found in the park—or that has found him—bearing only the name "Sylvia" on her name tag. A street-smart mixture of Lab and Poodle, Sylvia becomes a major bone of contention between husband and wife. She offers Greg an escape from the frustrations of his job and the unknowns of middle age. To Kate, Sylvia becomes a rival for affection. And Sylvia thinks Kate just doesn't understand the relationship between man and dog, putting their marriage in serious jeopardy. Join us for this complicated relationship between man, wife and dog.

On Golden Pond

Auditions are Feb 10 & 11 Shows Apr 23-26; May 2-3; 5-9 & 14-16

This is the love story of Ethel and Norman Thayer, who are returning to their summer home on Golden Pond for the forty-eighth year. He is a retired professor, nearing eighty, with heart palpitations and a failing memory—but still as tart-tongued, observant and eager for life as ever. Ethel, ten years younger, and the perfect foil for Norman, delights in all the small things that have enriched and continue to enrich their long life together. They are visited by their divorced, middle-aged daughter and her dentist fiancé, who then go off to Europe, leaving his teenage son behind for the summer. The boy quickly becomes the "grandchild" the elderly couple have longed for, and as Norman revels in taking his ward fishing and thrusting good books at him, he also learns some lessons about modern teenage awareness—and slang—in return. In the end, as the summer wanes, so does their brief idyll, and in the final, deeply moving moments of the play, Norman and Ethel are brought even closer together by the incidence of a mild heart attack. Time, they know, is now against them, but the years have been good and, perhaps, another summer on Golden Pond still awaits.



Sylvia, by A.R. Guerney


Auditions November 11 & 12, 2019 January 30-February 15, 2020

On Golden Pond, by Ernest Thompson


Auditions February 10 & 11, 2020 April 23—May 16, 2020


